

Powerful Leviathan Spirit Deliverance Prayer

Heavenly Father, I come before You in the mighty and victorious name of Jesus Christ, my Lord and Savior, bowing in awe at Your throne of grace, trusting in Your promise that You have granted me authority over all the power of the enemy, ensuring nothing shall by any means harm me (Luke 10:19, NKJV). I acknowledge You as the Almighty God who shatters every chain and sets the captives free, humbling myself under Your mighty hand, knowing You resist the proud but pour out abundant grace upon the humble (James 4:6), and I lay my pride, arrogance, and self-exaltation at Your feet, seeking Your transformative mercy. With a broken and contrite heart, I confess and repent for every instance where my tongue has become a weapon of twisted words, sarcasm, mockery, and contempt toward others, wounding instead of building up; I repent for every harsh word, manipulation, exaggeration, half-truth, and the bitterness or unforgiveness that has opened doors to the enemy, asking You to forgive and cleanse me as I turn from these sins (1 John 1:9). Lord Jesus, I choose now to forgive every person who has hurt, misrepresented, mocked, or spoken against me— [name specifics: spouse, children, parents, siblings, friends, coworkers, church family, enemies]— releasing them from my judgment into Your loving hands, blessing them with Your peace, and letting go of all resentment, the desire for revenge, and the heavy chains of bitterness that have bound my spirit. I renounce every ungodly agreement, vow, and curse I have made with my mouth, breaking declarations like “ I ’ ll never change, ” “ I can ’ t help it, ” “ This is just who I am, ” “ We ’ ll always fight, ” “ I ’ m naturally harsh, ” and “ I ’ ll never forgive, ” canceling these word-contracts by the precious blood of Jesus and declaring them null and void in the spiritual realm (Colossians 2:14-15). By the authority You have given me as a believer in Christ, I rise up in faith and command the leviathan spirit—along with every associated spirit of pride, twisting, confusion, strife, division, mockery, contempt, bitterness, unforgiveness, manipulation, deception, marine spirits, python spirits, and every entity that has twisted my words or others ’ —to leave me immediately. I declare with boldness that these spirits have no legal right to remain, for I am covered by the blood of Jesus Christ; I command them to depart now, go to the feet of Jesus, and never return to me or my family, sealed by the Holy Spirit ’ s indwelling power (James 4:7). I break every generational curse of pride, harsh words, family division, and communication breakdown that has flowed through my bloodline, standing in the gap for my ancestors and proclaiming that this pattern ends with me, shattering these curses off my children and their children in Jesus ’ name (Galatians 3:13-14). Holy Spirit, I invite You now to flood every cleansed space within me with Your divine presence, filling me with truth that sets me free, gentleness to heal my relationships, patience to endure, kindness to uplift, self-control to reign over my tongue, and peace that surpasses understanding (Galatians 5:22-23). Transform my heart of stone into a heart of flesh, teaching me to speak words of life, encouragement, and truth in love, as apples of gold in settings of silver (Proverbs 25:11); set a guard over my mouth, O Lord, and keep watch over the door of my lips, dedicating my tongue to You, Jesus, that my speech may be seasoned with grace and salt (Colossians

4:6). Make me quick to listen, slow to speak, and slow to anger (James 1:19), and when tempted by pride or harshness, remind me to pause and seek Your heart first; I put on the full armor of God— the belt of truth, the breastplate of righteousness, the gospel of peace on my feet, the shield of faith, the helmet of salvation, and the sword of the Spirit— declaring that I am more than a conqueror through Christ who loves me (Romans 8:37). I seal this prayer and this deliverance by the precious blood of Jesus, proclaiming that what God has cleansed, no one can call unclean (Acts 10:15), and I stand in the triumphant victory won for me at Calvary.
